VERMONT STATUTES AND RULES

- <u>STATUTE 30 V.S.A. CHAPTER 86 (§§ 7001 7008) UNDERGROUND</u> <u>UTILITY DAMAGE PREVENTION SYSTEM</u>
- <u>PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION RULE 3.800 UNDERGROUND UTILITY</u> <u>DAMAGE PREVENTION</u>



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DEFINITION OF "COMPANY"

"Company" means any public utility, municipality, or person that supplies gas, electricity, hot water, steam, telecommunications service, or cable television system that maintains underground utility facilities.



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DEFINITION OF "EXCAVATION ACTIVITIES"

30 V.S.A. § 7001(4) "EXCAVATION ACTIVITIES" means any activities that will <u>disturb</u> the subsurface of the <u>earth or</u> could <u>damage underground utility facilities</u> <u>and</u> that <u>may</u> involve the <u>removal</u> of earth, rock, or other <u>materials in the ground <u>or</u> the <u>demolition of any</u> <u>structure by</u> the discharge of <u>explosives <u>or</u> the <u>use of powered or mechanized equipment</u>, including digging, trenching, blasting, boring, drilling, hammering, post driving, wrecking, razing, tunneling, or <u>pavement or concrete slab removal</u> within 100 feet of an underground <u>utility facility</u>.</u></u>

Excavation activities shall <u>not</u> include the <u>tilling of the soil for **agricultural** purposes</u>, <u>routine</u> <u>home gardening with hand tools</u> outside easement areas and public rights-of-way, activities relating to <u>routine public highway maintenance</u>, <u>or</u> the <u>use of hand tools</u> by a <u>company</u>, <u>or</u> the company's agent or a contractor working under the agent's direction, to locate or service the company's facilities, provided the company has a written damage prevention program.

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30 V.S.A. § **7004** – *proposed amendments 2024*

- (c) at least 48-72 hours, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, but not more than 30 days before commencing excavation activities, each person required to give notice of excavation activities shall notify the system referred to in section 7002 of this title. such notice shall set forth a reasonably accurate and readily identifiable description of the geographical location of the proposed excavation activities and the premarks.
- (d) notice to the system may be in writing or by telephone or electronic means. for purposes of this section, the system shall provide a toll-free telephone number.

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30 V.S.A. § 7007 NOTICE OF DAMAGE

When any underground utility facility is damaged during excavation activities, the excavator shall immediately notify the affected company. Under no circumstances shall the excavator backfill or conceal the damaged area until the company inspects and repairs the damage, provided that the excavator shall take reasonable and prudent actions to protect the public from serious injury from the damaged facilities until the company or emergency response personnel arrive at the damaged area. An excavator who causes <u>damage to a pipeline</u> that results in a release of natural or other gas or hazardous liquid shall **promptly** report the release to emergency responders by calling 911.

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PUC RULE 3.805(C) NOTICE OF DAMAGE - UTILITIES

UPON DISCOVERY OF DAMAGE TO UNDERGROUND FACILITIES BY EXCAVATION ACTIVITIES OR OTHER ACTION THAT MAY CONSTITUTE A PROBABLE VIOLATION OF 30 V.S.A. §§ 7004, 7006A, 7006B, OR 7007, A COMPANY SHALL FORWARD AN UNDERGROUND FACILITY DAMAGE PREVENTION REPORT TO THE COMMISSION AND TO THE DEPARTMENT ON THE FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSION.

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DEPTH OF NATURAL GAS LINES – 49 CFR PART 192

MAINS - § 192.327 COVER

- INSTALLED WITH AT LEAST <u>24</u> INCHES OF COVER.
- EXCEPT:
 - WHERE AN UNDERGROUND STRUCTURE PREVENTS THE INSTALLATION BUT ADDITIONAL PROTECTION TO WITHSTAND ANTICIPATED EXTERNAL LOADS IS REQUIRED.
 - **IF THE LAW OF THE STATE OR MUNICIPALITY:**
- ESTABLISHES A MINIMUM COVER OF LESS THAN 24 INCHES;
- REQUIRES THAT MAINS BE INSTALLED IN A COMMON TRENCH WITH OTHER UTILITY LINES; AND
- **PROVIDES ADEQUATELY FOR PREVENTION OF DAMAGE TO THE PIPE BY EXTERNAL FORCES.**

SERVICE LINES - § 192.361 SERVICE LINES: INSTALLATION

• DEPTH – BURIED SERVICE LINE MUST BE INSTALLED AT LEAST <u>12</u> INCHES OF COVER (PRIVATE PROPERTY) AND AT LEAST <u>18</u> INCHES OF COVER IN STREETS AND ROADS. HOWEVER, IF AN UNDERGROUND STRUCTURE PREVENTS INSTALLATION AT THOSE DEPTHS, LINE MUST BE ABLE TO WITHSTAND ANTICIPATED EXTERNAL LOAD.

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CIVIL PENALTIES

- ⁹ 30 V.S.A. § 7008: ANY PERSON OR <u>COMPANY</u> WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISIONS OF TITLE 30 SECTIONS 7004, 7006, 7006A, 7006B, OR 7007 <u>SHALL</u> BE SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF NOT MORE THAN:
 - \$500.00 FOR THE FIRST OFFENSE,
 - \$1,000.00 FOR THE SECOND OFFENSE WITHIN ONE YEAR OF THE DATE OF THE FIRST OFFENSE,
 - \$1,500.00 FOR THE THIRD OFFENSE WITHIN ONE YEAR OF THE FIRST OFFENSE, AND
 - \$5,000.00 FOR THE FOURTH OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE WITHIN ONE YEAR OF THE DATE OF A PREVIOUS OFFENSE

 PUC RULE 3.807(J): IN IMPOSING A CIVIL PENALTY, THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIDER THE GRAVITY OF THE VIOLATION, THE <u>CULPABILITY</u> OF THE PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THE VIOLATION, ANY <u>HISTORY</u> OF PRIOR VIOLATIONS, THE <u>GOOD FAITH</u> OF THE PERSON IN ATTEMPTING TO ACHIEVE COMPLIANCE, THE <u>SIZE</u> OF THE COMPANY BEING CHARGED, THE LIKELY <u>DETERRENT</u> EFFECT OF THE PENALTY, AND ANY OTHER RELEVANT OR <u>MITIGATING</u> <u>FACTORS</u>.
